1. Welcome and Approval of March Minutes

• Heather Sinclair, Parent Council Co-Chair, welcomed everyone and presented the agenda and past meeting minutes.

2. Principal / Vice-Principal's Report

Principal Ann Perez welcomed the group and provided an update:

- Schoolyard project: construction will likely start early, perhaps within a month. Much of schoolyard will be off limits during construction, so we're working on creative options to manage recess, etc. Party in the playground, scheduled for June 8th, will be impacted
- Planning/Modeling for 2017/2018 school year: process is underway. Staffing model has been approved for next year. School allocation is based on the projected enrollment for next year generated by and the planning department. Teachers are getting their assignments for next year and classes will be built in May. Plans are not finalized until all enrolment numbers are confirmed later in the school year
- classes 1 to 3 can't be over 20 (without exemption from ministry, which doesn't occur frequently)

- TDSB Census: April is census month, provides meaningful in formation for TDSB. It is anonymous and confidential. Grade 7/8 students will be filling out a census. JK Grade 3 parents will fill out census. In grade 4-6 both parents and children will fill out the census
- **EQAO testing** (May 23 Jun 5). Insightful for the school to get the data to see what areas are strong and what areas need additional focus. Programming is then adjusted accordingly. Testing is not laborious (math is 2 one hour sessions and English is 4 one hour sessions, over the course of two weeks)



- School Cash Online: 34% of community has registered, positive & successful early adoption. As more events come online, expect enrollment to go up
- **Stem Showcase** (May 3rd): working with learning coach this year, focusing on Math. He will do a presentation to parents with examples of how we're working with children and math. Demos of robotics

3. Treasurer Update (Jim Witty)

• School cash online: will hopefully be set and ready for Bingo night. Reporting is efficient and the plan is to eliminate paypal for next year to save money (\$1000 in paypal fees for 2015/2016 school year)

4. Committee Reports

a) SoFun

- Party in the playground: given schoolyard construction, will scale it back (take out the inflatables and maximize other events. Will leverage the gyms, and classrooms, preserve dunk tank and bring in some games. Call it 'party for the playground'. Planning committee open to additional ideas and suggestions from parents)
- **Bingo** (05-May): two sessions scheduled to manage size of crowd. Need parent volunteers the night of. Prizes required. 6 grand prizes still required (tickets, large lego, etc)

b) Allergy

- see Appendix A for mission statement and protective procedure proposal
- non-food based birthday treats in the classroom discussed (e.g. books for birthdays donate to library or classroom, decorate a box with birthday paper and each child puts something in the box about the person, bring something in the child can sign. Child's birthday acknowledged over morning announcements. Teachers do "star day". No homework pass for older kids, designated day a month for birthday snacks, etc)
- school wide celebrations typically involve school wide notifications, so not the same issue as ad-hoc food celebrations
- Teacher feedback: has been a topic of discussion in last two division meetings. General alignment to the proposal and agreement that it will alleviate disruption from the day
- next meeting: April, email Annabel Zbogar for details
- Next step: Ann to review/approve proposed policy and implementation plan for September of 2017

c) Sustainability and Environmental Committee
