- School Yard Improvement: 97% completed, painting done, waiting on storage unit for play equipment (will paint
 on it, mural, etc); once this is brought into the yard, the fence will be closed. Note: the plan was for the hockey
 area to be painted blue now investigating what this would cost
- The total cost for schoolyard improvement is expected to be ~\$42,000 (yet to receive final invoice); \$36,000 in account for schoolyard improvement \$6,561 balance expected to come from funds from last year (per above)

• Responsibility/Character assembly:

- o Every month the TDSB has a different character trait they focus on
- o Each month through announcements & discussions in classroom, Humbercrest brings this trait to life
- Each teacher nominates a student and gives out certificate at assembly (September was respect and fill each other's bucket)
- This month theme = responsibility; eco-team put together videos to show responsibility around school and environment and presented to three different divisions
- **Feedback:** pay attention to who gets these awards year over year and discuss in the classroom that just because you didn't get award, doesn't mean you aren't responsible
- Sergeant Norm Baker: turning 101, former Humbercrest student; attending the remembrance day assembly 10-Nov; CTV news is doing a story on him (Brenda Bennett is gathering her class and having a meeting with him prior; then he'll join the assembly)
- Report cards: home next week and Parent/Teacher interviews on Thursday/Friday (16/17-Nov)
- T-shirt sales: on sale Parent/Teacher interview night, many more that are little (not a lot of youth medium)
- **EQAO:** school improvement goals include:
 - o written expression and student voice; focus will be on taking their ideas, organizing them and creating a paragraph to convey their thinking around a problem or challenge
 - o higher level and open ended thinking (vs multiple choice)
- **TDSB curriculum:** in the Humbercrest newsletter include a "did you know" section and direct parents to teachers for questions about the curriculum (e.g. typing, printing, cursive practice)

Vice Principal Shauna Davidson welcomed the group and provided an update:

- Playground Pals: Gym teacher met with Playground Pals to train older kids to play with younger kids interactive, positive program (not winner/loser), creates character and continuity; started this (20 or 30 pals); happens at lunch; Pals where pinnies to identify themselves during grade 1 and 2 lunch time
- Holiday helpers: open to everyone, a few classes are participating (10) and will do a sign up and donation (other classes have other initiatives planned).
- Holiday Drives planned for Humbercrest: food drive fundraising, coat drive, mitten drive
